- Co-monitoring with City on occupancy issues
- Continue work with City Police to address behavioral issues – Sgt. Dennis Colclasure
- Pop up events continue to present challenges

Community Service

- Over 160,000 service hours last academic year
- Recognition on President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll annually
- This fall 650 volunteers served more than 150 neighbors during Bee The Difference Day
- Provided service to 35 area agencies
- Service trips each year during fall, winter and spring breaks (Chicago, IL, Memphis, TN, Kansas City, MO)
- \$251,000+ raised for the Children's Miracle Network by SAU Dance Marathon student group
- CommUNITY Day event south of Locust with QCBT was unfortunately cancelled due to weather

Campus Happenings

○ **Athletic Teams Added for Fall 2018**

- Esports Team for Fall 2018 – collegiate competition in “Overwatch” and “League of Legends”
- Color guard added to 60+ marching band

○ **Educational Access and Affordability**

- Holding tuition and fees increases to record lows
- Award over \$30 million in scholarship aid annually
- 75% had an internship or participated in a clinical, practicum, field, or student teaching experience.
- 90% Were employed, attending grad school, volunteering, or in military service within six months of graduation

○ **On-line Textbook Initiative**

- Textbook costs can be \$900-\$1200 per semester
- Contracted with Minnesota Open Textbook Network [OTN]
- Anticipated savings for students could surpass \$1 million

Parking Oversight

- Require all students to register vehicles
 - Contract look up for vehicles of concern
- Communications to students to use our lots
- We monitor on-street parking and continue to encourage student use of lots
- Focused on area around CHS building this fall
- Report illegal parking on streets to City
- Zone 2 and Rogalski Faculty Staff lots are available for general use from 3 p.m. – 7 a.m.
- Neighbor contacts and photos are helpful

Parking Availability – Spring 2018

- Managing lot usage to accommodate demand:
 - Zone 1 – 647 spaces [R 1.2] = 792 permits sold
 - Zone 2 – 552 spaces [R 1.3] = 748 permits sold
 - Zone 3* – 98 spaces [R 1.0] = 57 issued [no cost]
- * Generally seeing lots full 10 am – 2 pm
 - Zone 1 lot of 144 spaces converted to Zone 2 [lot East of McCarthy Hall (Gaines & Lombard)]
 - Working to acquire use of 97 spaces in Genesis West parking lot for Health Science building use

St. Vincent's Center Development

- Location on Central Park Avenue, south of fields
- Varsity Athletics Offices and Equipment Facility
 - Footprint 6372 SF
 - Offices for football, lacrosse, and softball coaches
 - Lockers, restrooms, and showers for the football and lacrosse teams
 - Training area and laundry space
 - Basement will be used to store football and lacrosse equipment and equipment for the entire complex
 - On track for anticipated completion date is by June 2018, staff will occupy in July, and serve athletes beginning in August
 - Administrative approval by the City of Davenport staff

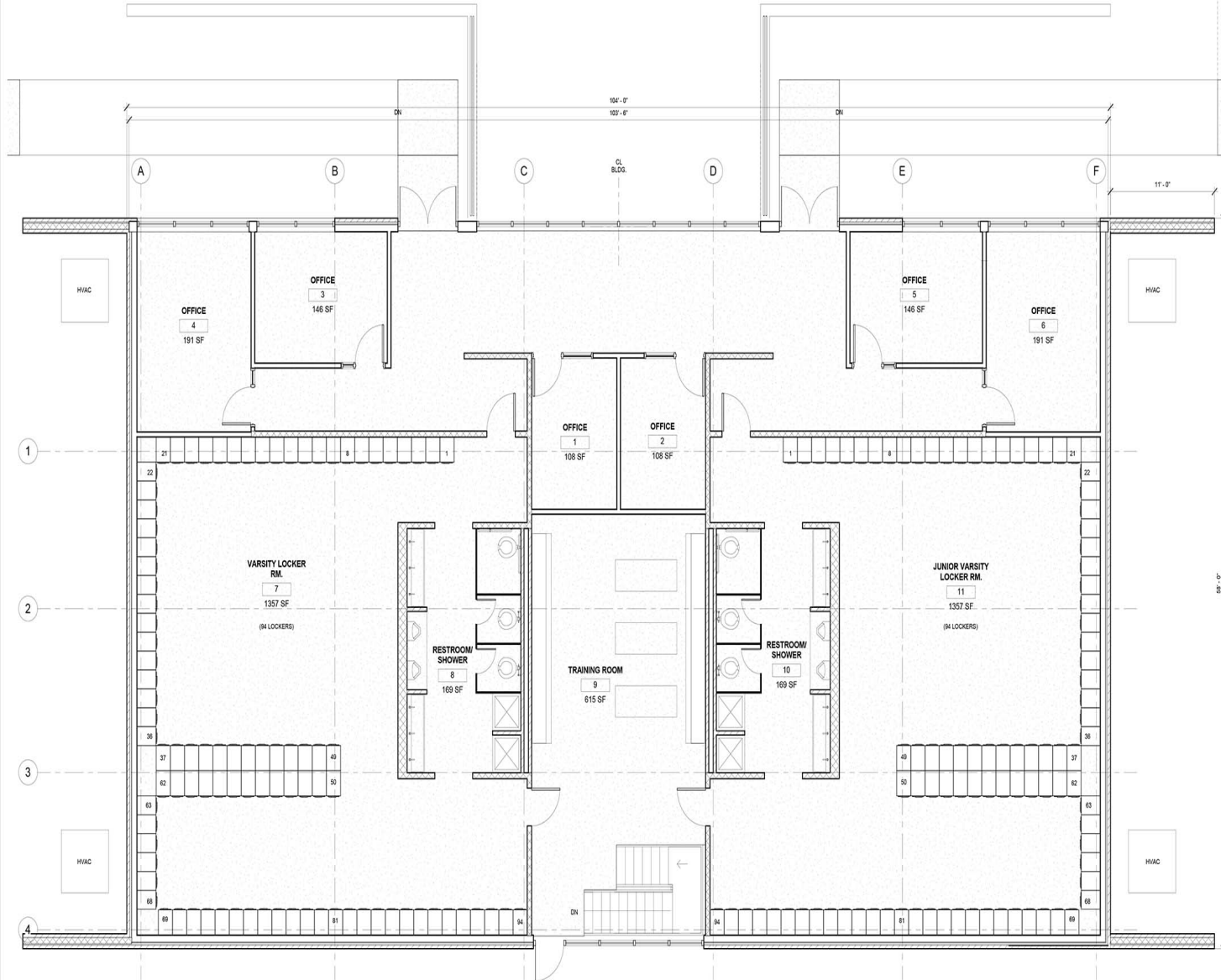

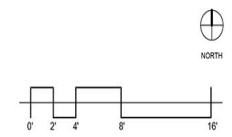
**UPPER LEVEL FLOOR
